

Get away from the hustle and bustle of daily life and have a fun-filled day in the cradle of nature. There are also many villages that are classed as 'villages of character' which are well worth the visit and make great photo opportunities.


Balazuc is one of the villages of character located halfway between Aubenas and Vallon-Pont-d'Arc and is one of the most beautiful villages in all of France. Overlooking the Ardèche River, the village is dotted with winding alleys and its historic center is home to old stone houses and small craft shops. At the foot of the village, a long beach allows you to refresh on sunny days.

It is in Vallon-Pont-d'Arc that you can start your descent down the river to Saint-Martin-d'Ardèche by canoe or visit the famous Chauvet Cave. It is Ardèche's heritage where you can admire masterpieces of prehistoric cave art.

On the foothills of Cévennes, the idyllic village of Labeaume is nestled against limestone cliffs. There is also a large square shaded by hundred-year-old plane trees and a chapel with an extraordinary view of about twenty bell towers. From Labeaume, several hiking trails lead to numerous dolmens in the surrounding area

At the foot of the impressive cliffs, the charming village of Vogué with its small terraced houses and cobbled streets has all the characteristics of the ancient villages of Ardèche. A superbly renovated castle and suspended gardens with spectacular views on the banks of the river are what make this village picturesque.

With a history of over 2,000 years, the village of Alba la Romaine is an idyllic hamlet built around a basalt peak, a castle, and a volcanic peak. The village is surrounded by numerous vineyards. You can discover that the 15th-century ramparts in this medieval village are majestic. The village is clad in white limestone and black basalt, giving it a unique gothic atmosphere.



Domaine de la Mordorée - Visit the Vineyard and Wine Tasting

During your visit, walk through the vineyards and listen to the guides' passionate explanations of the Domaine de la Mordorée's values, learn about organic farming principles, and learn about the vineyard work.

You'll be taken to the Plateau de Vallongue to take in the view of the Cru de Tavel vineyards, the village, and the surrounding reliefs. The loop concludes with Tavel's historic village, rinsing and cooling courtyard.

After a 3km walk, you will end with a tasting at the Domaine de la Mordorée of several vintages produced from the vineyards visited, particularly the rosé wines of Tavel.

After this exciting activity, we recommend strolling through the lovely provencal village of Les Baux-de-Provence and having dinner in a cozy restaurant.

Suggestion: Visit Les Baux-de-Provence

Clinging to an ancient limestone, Les Baux-de-Provence is a typical Provencal fortified hilltop village situated in the Regional Natural Park of the Alpilles. It was mainly built between the 15th-16th centuries and is listed among the "most beautiful villages of France."

Nestled in the Alpilles mountains, it offers great views of the plains, the Mediterranean Sea, and the stunning rocky landscape of the Alpilles. Narrow cobbled streets wind car-free past ancient houses, up to splendid castle ruins sitting on top of a rocky outcrop above the village. The small chapel was built in the 12th century.

The Carrières de Lumières is an ancient quarry now used for regular exhibitions with artworks projected against the quarry walls – a real spectacle of light and sound! The theme of the spectacle changes every year.

Suggestion - Dinner at Restaurant Le Mas d'Aigret in Les Baux-de-Provence

Indulge in refined Provencal cuisine on the superb terrace with a crystal clear view of the Alpilles and the Château des Baux. The dishes are prepared using fresh local and seasonal products. Typical gourmet dishes will also be prepared for special occasions.

DAY 6

Explore the past of Domaine du Mas de Rey, one of the oldest wine-producing Mas Camarguais, which over many centuries has inspired many families to cultivate rare and local grape varieties. Chasan, Caladoc, and Marselan are bespoken wines famous worldwide. A majestic sphinx in the cellar still bears witness to each of the owners as they have left an incredible mark on the estate. The estate dates back to the templars of the 12th century and has survived until today with a commitment to organic farming.

Your guide will introduce you to different producers in the region. The olives come from the Cornille Mill in the Baux valley and the Bastidettes provide the tapenades and other

spreads. Don't miss the delicious fruit juices from the Grand Mas du Roy. Enjoy an aperitif and a tasting of four wines!



Suggestion - Visit Arles

Arles is a city with an antique past that has been recognized by UNESCO for its Roman and Romanesque monuments, its pilgrimage routes (Santiago de Compostela, Rome and Jerusalem), and also for the world-renowned Camargue Regional Nature Park – a member of the World Biosphere Reserves network.

Arles is the gateway to the Camargue at the delta of the Rhône River, among some of Europe's most beautiful natural sites. Its flora and fauna – protected by the Camargue Regional Nature Park – are exceptionally rich and varied. To the north of the city stretches the Alpilles Regional Nature Park, with agricultural land and Mediterranean forests, which is a habitat for more than one hundred rare or protected species. The city of Arles is closely connected to the Post-Impressionist artist Vincent Van Gogh whose stay in Arles was one of the most productive periods in his career, with over 300 paintings and drawings completed in 15 months. This quiet activity is followed by an extraordinary action-packed tour.

Get away from it all on a jeep. Accompanied by your guide, you will discover the 500 hectare estate, divided between rice paddies and pastures. The famous white horses will go with you for this ride off the beaten track which will take you close to the Camargue

bulls. By jeep, your guide, a native of the region, will reveal to you all the hidden gems of the wild and secret Camargue.



Suggestion – Dinner at Restaurant L'Aupiho Domaine de Manville in Les Baux de Provence

The delicate and thoughtful cuisine of Restaurant L'Aupiho elevates it to new heights.

The chef prepares the dishes using locally sourced ingredients. The cuisine of l'Aupiho is available to be enjoyed in the interior courtyard, which was Manville's former agricultural domain. The terrace, shaded by century-old plane trees and refreshed by the swimming pool and fountain, is ideal for a summer lunch or dinner.

Wine and Private Visit in Aix-en-Provence

The Silvacane Abbey is a Cistercian abbey in the Bouches du Rhone community of La Roque d'Antheron. It gets its name from the reeds of the Durance River, which runs alongside the abbey. It is the newest of three Cistercian abbeys in Provence and the only one that has ceased monastic activity. The abbey has been owned by the town of La Roque d'Anthéron since January 2008.


Time travel through history and understand the Cistercian influence at Silcacane Abbey. Wander in the high stone vaults and discover the church, dormitory, cloister and other varied rooms. The abbey bookstore offers a large selection of books along with varied items like calligraphy caskets, CDs, jewelry, essential oil, soap, honey, herbal tea, and products of the land.

Private Visit & Tasting at Château de Beaupré

You will be welcomed in the courtyard of the estate and then will be briefed on the history of the vineyard, which has been around since 1855.

Also visit the imperial Palace of Pharo, built by Napoleon III for his empress Eugenie in 1858. This remarkable monument served as the only military institute in Europe specializing in the field of tropical medicine. Until 2013, for more than 100 years, the palace was home to doctors, and civil and military medical technicians to practice medicine. At the end of the day, a unique experience awaits you – a sunset boat trip!







From the harbor, you can climb to the Colline du Château for great views of the city. Despite the name, there is no longer a castle on the hill, as it was destroyed in 1706. Now there is a beautiful park with views of the beach stretching along the Baie des Anges ("Angel Bay").

The beach might be Nice's most famous attraction. The famous "Promenade des Anglais" boardwalk follows the Mediterranean seafront for 3 miles (5 kilometers). This gave the boardwalk its name, which translates to the "Walkway of the English."



One of the most popular and interesting excursions! Visit some of the most beautiful parts of **Greece** and the most important archaeological sites in **Argolis**, **Olympia**, **Delphi** and **Meteora**.

Itinerary

Day 1

Leaving Athens behind we drive on the coastal road towards the West. Our first stop (after approximately one hour) is the **Corinth Canal**. There we'll make a short stop, enough to see the Canal, (approximately 6 km long connecting the **Aegean** with the **Ionian Sea**), take photos and visit the local cafeteria. Twenty minutes later we'll arrive at the small town of **Ancient Corinth** where we'll visit the archaeological site with the unique monolithic **Temple of Apollo** (one of the oldest in Greece, 585 B.C.), and the **Bema** from where **St. Paul** preached and the museum.

Driving afterwards through the hills of Corinth, among thousands of olive trees and vineyards, we'll arrive at the prefecture of **Argolis** where we'll visit the archaeological site of **Mycenae**.

Mycenae, 'Rich in Gold', was the kingdom of mythical **Agamemnon** who dominated the **Aegean Sea** after the distraction of the **Minoan Empire**. The city looks out across the plain of **Argos** to the sea. Its elevated position and its huge **Cyclopean** Walls offered protection from surprise attacks by pirates and enemies. At the peak of its power (1300 B.C.) the population resided around the fortress where the Royal Family resided. The Palace, symbol of power of the Mycenaean rulers, was reached by a large ramp beginning at the **Lions Gate**.

Outside the fortress lie the impressive beehive tombs including that ascribed to Agamemnon known also as the **Treasury of Atreas**.

After concluding our visit to Mycenae we'll drive through the plain of **Argos** among endless farms of orange trees and forty minutes later we'll arrive at the picturesque town of **Nafplion** (First capital of modern Greece from 1829 to 1834). Nafplion is the most ancient city in Greece. According to the myth it was founded by **Theseas** who first conceived the idea of organized cities where people could live together. The city lies under the imposing rocks of **Palamide** the most formidable Venetian Castle in the Eastern Mediterranean. The smaller Castle of **Acronafplia** (where the ancient city was founded) crowns Nafplion and at the entrance of the harbor, in the **Argolic Gulf**, there is yet another, third castle, **Bourtzi**, situated on a small islet.

Whether you decide to have lunch in the old medieval quarter, with the narrow, stoned paved streets, or by the port, with the view of **Bourtzi**, **Nafplion** is the best choice for lunch in this trip.

After the conclusion of Argolis tour and lunch in Nafplion we'll depart for **Olympia** through the mountains of **Arcadia** in central Peloponesse (a very scenic drive) and we'll pass from various towns and villages, (**Tripolis**, **Vytina**, **Lagadia**). Finally we'll arrive in Olympia where we'll have diner and spend the night.

Day 2

After breakfast we are going to visit the archaeological site with the **Temple of Zeus** (where the gold and ivory statue of the god was placed -one of the seven wonders of the ancient world – work of the master sculptor **Fedias**) the **Temple of Hera** (where the lighting of the Olympic Flame takes place every four years) the original ancient **Olympic Stadium** and many more monuments. After the archaeological site we will visit the Museum.

The Archaeological Museum of **Olympia** is one of the most important museums in Greece. The museum's permanent exhibition contains finds from the sacred precinct of **Altis** and the rest archaeological site dating from the prehistoric era. Among the many precious exhibits you we will also see the famous marble statues of **Hermes of Praxiteles** and the **Nike** (Victory) of **Paionios**.

After the conclusion of our tour we can have lunch in the town of Olympia and then start our trip to **Delphi**, where we'll arrive in the evening. In Delphi we can have diner in a local Greek restaurant and stay overnight.

Day 3

After breakfast we will visit the famous **Oracle of Delphi**. We will see the **Castalia Spring** and the main archaeological site (the **Temple of Apollo**, the **Treasury of the Athenians**, the **Theatre**, the **Stadium**, etc.) and the Museum with the famous statue of **Antinoos** and the unique bronze statue of the **Charioteer** dated from 475 B.C.









After our visit to the Museum we'll drive down the slope for about a mile to visit the ruins of the **Temple of Athena Pronea** and the **Tholos**.













After the conclusion of our Delphi Tour we can have lunch in a traditional Greek restaurant in town and then we'll depart for **Meteora**. We will enjoy our drive through the mountains of central Greece and we will pass by various towns and villages, (**Lamia**, **Domokos**, **Trikala**) After our drive we will arrive at **Kalambaka** (the town right below the rocks of Meteora) where we'll have diner and can spend night. We can also stay overnight in the nearby village of **Kastraki**.









Day 4

After breakfast we'll start our tour to the **Monasteries** until lunch time in the afternoon. After lunch we'll start our return trip to Athens. Almost half the distance to Athens we can stop at **Thermopylae** to see the statue of **Leonidas**, the **King of the Spartans**, who fell in the battle with all his 300 warriors fighting the **Persians of Xerxes** in 480 B.C.

After lunch in **Nafplion** (the first day) we can continue with the tour of **Argolis**, visiting **Epidaurus**. (extended Argolis tour). Epidaurus is famous for its ancient Theatre and the sanctuary of Asclepios.

The sanctuary of **Asclepios** was a healing centre as well as a cultural centre in ancient times. Epidaurus was built around the 4th Century B.C. and has a multitude of buildings most famous of which is the ancient **Theatre of Epidaurus**. The Theatre of Epidaurus has reached our days almost intact. The view, aesthetics and acoustics of the theatre are breathtaking. It's still in use today and hosts carefully selected theatrical plays, concerts, and festivals during the summer. For an actor to perform in the Theatre of Epidaurus is considered the greatest honour and the ultimate acknowledgement of his or her talent, if he wins over the tough audience.

After concluding our visit to Epidaurus we'll return to Nafplion and the afternoon will be free to explore the old medieval quarter with the traditional restaurants hidden in the narrow, stone paved streets and the port with all the modern cafeterias with view to the **Bourtzi Castle**.

Next morning, after breakfast, we are going to visit **Palamide** fortress. Here you will have a choice of either climbing the authentic stairway of 999 steps to the entrance of the castle or driving directly to the top!

After visiting Palamide we are going to drive over the mountains of **Arcadia** to **Bassae**. In Bassae we will visit the imposing **Temple of Epikourios Apollo**. We can have lunch in any of the towns we will drive through during our trip. (**Megalolpoli, Karytaina, Andritsena**).


The **Temple of Epikourios Apollo**, one of the most importannt and imposing ancient Temples, stands in the bare and rocky landscape of **Bassae** 1.100 m above the sea level. Attributed to **Iktinos**, one of the master architects of the **Parthenon**, in Athens, the Temple dates back to 420-400 BC. Excavations have revealed that this surviving Temple was was the third to have been erected on the site. The remains of the two previous Temples date back to 600 and 500 BC. It is very interesting that some of the architectural elements of these two previous Temples can still be seen today.

Clontarf Castle will provide you with the warmest Irish welcome to their distinctive luxury hotel. The castle has a rich history, with the first structure on the site being built all the way back in 1172. Many hands have taken ownership of Clontarf in the years since, including the Knights Templar. Nowadays, the designers have done an exquisite job of blending a sleek modern look throughout the historic building.

While it may be in the heart of a busy city, Clontarf Castle sits in a peaceful spot nearby a golf course, St Anne's Park, and the beautiful Irish Sea.



Having spent some time travelling, the name of the game today is relaxing in preparation for your first full day of touring in the morning. Dinner – Knights Bar, Clontarf Castle

In the morning you will tuck into a hearty Irish breakfast which will serve you well as your first activity today is a **private walking tour of Dublin**, a city which is absolutely bursting at the seams with enchanting stories.

Your chauffeur will drive you into the heart of the city, where you will be met by your expert tour guide. The tour kicks off with a visit to **Dublin Castle** which dates back to 1230 after King John of England decided that a castle should be built to defend Dublin. Its location is no accident as it was strategically placed such that the River Poddle would provide a natural barrier against any invading armies.

Serving many purposes over the years – defensive fortress, parliament, court, military base – Dublin Castle has played an instrumental role throughout Ireland's history, and your guide will go into all the (sometimes grizzly) details.



From there you will wind your way past City Hall and on to **Trinity College Library**. Here you will get a chance to view some of the treasured artefacts they have on display, such as the Proclamation of the Irish Republic (1916), "Brian Boru's" harp, which was crafted in the 14th century, and the **Book of Kells**, which was written in the 9th century. The Book of Kells is written in Latin and is considered one of the most important manuscripts in Christian literature. It was written by Columban monks and depicts the four Gospels.

Next up is a truly unique experience – the **Viking Splash Tour**. You will climb aboard an amphibious World War II DUKW or "duck" to see more of Dublin, firstly by land but then by water as you splash your way into the Grand Canal basin. With informative commentary throughout, this exciting adventure is fun for the whole family.

Your chauffeur will then return you to **Clontarf Castle** where this evening you will be dining in the hotel's **Knights Bar**.

You will get to glimpse how people lived 100 years ago by visiting recreations of country homes and blacksmith's forges. There is also a petting zoo, museum, café, playground, butterfly garden, and space to hear traditional Irish music.



In the afternoon you will be treated to a **falconry experience at Ashford Castle**. Kids and adults alike will be in awe as these magnificent birds of prey swoop and soar and land on your gloved hand.

Ashford Castle will also be your home for the next two nights, and what a home it is. Words really do struggle to do justice to the grandeur and beauty of Ashford Castle, which is surrounded by pristinely kept grounds and sits on the banks of Lough (loch) Corrib.

There are plenty of activities on offer at Ashford Castle, including lake cruises, fishing, tennis, golf, clay pigeon shooting, and a magnificent spa to relax in.

Your trip includes a visit to The Old Steamers Quay and you will also pass by Lord Ardiluan's Obelisk, a tribute to an influential Irish politician and philanthropist.

This evening you will dine in the **George V Dining Room**, a marvellous sight to behold with detailed wood panelling and stunning Waterford Crystal chandeliers adorning the ceiling. Please note, gentlemen will be required to wear a dinner jacket.

Day 5 Burren National Park, Burren Farm Experience, Cliffs of Moher

After another delicious breakfast your driver will take you to **Burren National Park** for a chance to explore this unique wilderness. Often described as "otherworldly", you will soon realise this is an apt description as the vast expanses of exposed limestone rock make it look like something from another planet entirely. Indeed, the name Burren comes from the Irish "Boíreann", which means "rocky place". The limestone here was formed by sediment settling to the bottom of a tropical sea which covered nearly all of Ireland 350,000,000 years ago.

However, don't be fooled into thinking Burren equals barren, as there is an abundance of wildlife and rare plants to enjoy. Keep an eye out for peregrine falcons, hen harriers, pine martens, feral goats, foxes, red squirrels, viviparous lizards, and butterflies.

Up next is a trip to **Burren Farm Experience** where you will learn all about traditional Irish beef farming. Children will love the guided tour sitting atop hay bales on the back of the

farm's tractor and trailer. There is also an old ring fort, ruined settlement, a forest, and Shantaghphubble Chapel to explore.



You will then make your way to the **Cliffs of Moher**, one of Ireland's most popular tourist destinations, which sit high above the dramatic coastline of West Clare. The views across the Atlantic and Aran Islands are spectacular, so be sure to take your camera with you today! A unique visitor centre, carved into the rock in the style of a Hobbit-burrow, provides a space to learn more about the cliffs. O'Brien's Tower marks the highest point of the cliffs, a staggering 702 feet above the thundering sea below.

Your accommodation this evening is **Dromoland Castle** which has been providing visitors with the finest place to stay since the 16th century. Set on a 500-acre estate and boasting its own golf course, Dromoland Castle is the height of luxury.

Dinner will be served in the **Earl of Thomond Restaurant** where you can tuck into yellowfin tuna tartare, roast Burren lamb, Kelly Rock oysters, and Irish lobster.

Day 6 Craggaaunowen, Limerick, Bunratty Castle

Accommodation – Mount Juliet, Kilkenny (2 Nights)
Activities – Craggaunowen, Limerick, Bunratty Castle
Dinner – The Hound

First up today you will be taken to **Craggaunowen**. Here you can learn what it was like to live in the Bronze Age, with an immersive experience exploring a recreated Crannog, ancient island dwellings which were built on lakes or marshland so as to be easier to defend from attackers.

There was little privacy back then, as a single room formed the living area where people cooked, slept, and made everything they needed to get by using ancient craft techniques. Rather than a front door, animal hides were used to shield the entrance from the elements, though the clever design of having only one entrance meant that that was usually enough to keep out the wind and rain.

Be sure to make the trip to **Craggaunowen Castle** nearby which stood in ruins for much of its life but has been painstakingly renovated to allow visitors to enjoy the many artifacts housed inside.



You will then visit **Limerick**, which sits on the winding banks of the River Shannon. Highlights here include King John's Castle, St Mary's Cathedral, and the Treaty Stone upon which was carved the Treaty of Limerick that marked the official surrender of Limerick to William of Orange.

From there it is just a short journey to **Bunratty Castle** and the adjoining **Bunratty Folk Park**. The spot on which the castle is built has been occupied since the Vikings conquered parts of Ireland and has since been home to countless Irish nobility. While it did fall into disrepair eventually, Bunratty Castle received significant investment and renovation work in the 1960's which has restored it to its former glory.

The Folk Park is a collection of buildings typical to life in 19th century Ireland, with a drapery, pottery shop, post office, doctor's house, and pub. This allows you to experience living in an entirely different era of Irish history, while kids will find endless fun on the fairy trail, walled garden, Viking playground, and animal enclosure with donkeys, ducks, deer, and goats.

Tonight, you will stay at **Mount Juliet Estate** in Kilkenny where dinner will be served in **The Hound Restaurant**. This estate, rich in history, boasts two distinct accommodations: the Georgian Manor House and Hunter's Yard.

Day 7 Kilkenny, Kilkenny Castle, Castlecomer Discovery Park

Your final day of touring begins with a visit to **Kilkenny**, a city which blurs the boundaries between old and new. There is a distinct feel to Kilkenny, also known as the "Marble City", due to many of its beautiful buildings being made from local Kilkenny marble. With cobbled streets and countless winding alleyways, it would be easy to spend the entire day just wandering around this magical medieval city.

If you want to learn more about Kilkenny's past, the Medieval Mile Museum is the spot for you. While if you prefer admiring stunning old architecture, be sure to take a trip to Rothe House and Gardens or The Black Abbey.

However, the pick of the bunch is **Kilkenny Castle**, a huge 800 year old fortress which has been remoulded many times over its intriguing past. It was originally built as a strategic

defensive location not long after the Norman's invaded Ireland. The castle was no stranger to battles over the following centuries. Oliver Cromwell laid siege to it in 1650, and during the Irish Civil War, Republicans took shelter as machine gun fire rained down from outside, causing major damage to the exterior walls.

Significant additions and redesign during the Victorian era repurposed Kilkenny Castle as a luxurious abode for noble families, and in the 20th century it was opened as a visitor attraction.



From there you will head to **Castlecomer Discovery Park** which, kids and adults alike will be delighted to know, boasts Ireland's longest zip line. Thrill seekers will love testing their fear of heights on the Octagon High Ropes Course, climbing wall, and Skywalk challenge. For those who prefer keeping their feet on the ground, you can try your hand at archery or axe throwing, as well as plenty of walking trails. Kayaking and canoeing are also available, and you can grab some lunch at the Canopy café in the Elf Village.

You will then be transported back to **Mount Juliet** for the final night of your tour. Nestled within a magnificent 260-year-old country manor, the **Lady Helen restaurant** offers an exquisite and refined dining experience.

The sublime scenery only gets better as you travel north through **Killarney National Park**; the first national park in Ireland and arguably the most beautiful. You will weave through glorious countryside and glistening lakes, with your driver stopping off at all the best photo opportunities. You will then tour **Muckross House and Gardens**. Set in the heart of the national park, near Muckross lake, this 19th century mansion was designed by the famous Scottish architect William Burn. After that it's off to the town of Killarney. Built around the banks of **Lough Leane**, the town is surrounded by a mountainous backdrop.

You will continue north until reaching **Moll's Gap**. This famous mountain pass cuts through the MacGillycuddy's Reeks mountains and is one of the most popular photo stops in Ireland.

Having seen so many wonderful sights, you will be hungry for a spot of lunch at Camo's, a charming little restaurant and wine bar offering a wide range of food, including the crispy battered fresh fish of the day. From there you will wind through **Killarney National**Park and make the short trip back to **The Europe Hotel**, where you can relax for a while before heading to dinner at the Porterhouse. This cosy spot offers it all, with delicious food, a wonderful ambience, and a huge selection of drinks on offer, including specialised whisky and gin.

Day 6 Slea Head Drive

Make sure you have a hearty breakfast, as you are about to embark on one of Ireland's most scenic drives. You will weave west along the coastline until you reach the town of **Dingle**, where you will begin the Slea Head Drive Route. This circular route, which is part of the Wild Atlantic Way, is dripping in beauty and history. You will make your way around the coastline until you reach **Dunbeg Fort**, the ruins of which date all the way back to the Iron Age. Take a look back at ancient Irish history while enjoying sweeping views over the Atlantic Ocean.

You will then make the short journey to the **Beehive Huts**. These Bronze Age dwellings have been well preserved and offer a glimpse of what life was like in the Bronze Age. You will then route around the coastline until you get views of the **Basket Islands**. These islands lie just off the coast and were inhabited until 1953. On a cold, wet, and windy day, the Basket Islands are battered by the elements and many people are astonished the island used to be inhabited.

After that, you will reach **Ballyferriter Village**, which provides beautiful views of the Three Sisters. These three peaks are draped in Irish mythology and legend has it that Lindbergh's first sight of land after crossing the Atlantic was the Three Peaks.

This will also offer you a chance to fill your belly as you pay a visit to **Tigh Ui Mhurchu**, or Murphy's. Don't be fooled by an understated exterior because the food on offer at Murphy's will have you wanting to go back again and again. If the sun is out, why not enjoy a cold Guinness in the beer garden.

Your next stop will be **Gallarus Oratory**. This ancient church has left archaeologists slightly confused as there is no hard evidence of when the church dates back to. Some believe the 12th century while others believe it was a Christian establishment built between the 6th and 9th century.



Your chauffeur will then drive you back to **The Europe Hotel**. If time permits, however, you can stop at **Inch Beach** to soak up the amazing views, before returning to the hotel for a relaxing evening.

From the **Cliffs of Moher**, you will travel inland until you reach **Burren National Park.** This stunning national park is home to an obscure limestone landscape, that looks almost

manmade. The swirling and circular limestone structures demonstrates the creativity of Mother Nature.



You will continue to venture north, passing through the famous town of **Galway**. If time permits, you can enjoy a quick stroll and take in this authentic Irish town. Your journey will continue until you reach your accommodation for the evening, **Glenlo Abbey**. This magnificent hotel sits within a 138 acre estate of glorious natural landscape, allowing for perfect peace and tranquillity as you admire the shores of Lough Corrib. You may only be 5 minutes away from Galway City, but you will feel like you're in a different world as the rugged beauty surrounds you. Routing north, you will tour through the town of Sligo. You will pass the famous **Benbulben**, a famous limestone mountain that stands at over 500 meters high. You will then be taken for lunch at Anderson's Grill and Bar, which was once the site of Ireland's largest brewing company. Many of the details of the building's industrial past have been preserved, adding to the rich historic feel of the place. The building may be old but the food is certainly fresh and you can also enjoy unique cocktails crafted to suit your favourite flavours by in-house mixologists.



After lunch you will pay a visit to the **Fairy Bridges**, sea stacks which are thousands of years old and form a delightful little bridge over the Atlantic below. If you're feeling out of luck, make sure to visit **Bundoran's Wishing Chair**. Simply sit, make your wish, and you will be blessed.

You then meander north into County Donegal, or as many call it, Gods Country. Weaving through the sculpted coastline and mountainous terrain, you will eventually reach **Lough Eske Castle**. This luxurious castle hotel sits in isolation on the edge of Donegal town. The castle was a seat of the revered O'Donnell clan for many years and is steeped in Irish history. The hotel has a long list of accolades, including "Luxury Hotel of The Year". This castle hotel has it all, a marvellous interior, an archaic outer shell, manicured gardens, and mouth-watering fine dining. Speaking of which, you will dine in the double AA Rosette **Cedars Restaurant**. Full height glass doors and windows provide uninterrupted views of the surrounding gardens and woodland, making for a delightful setting in which to enjoy the wide range of first-class food Cedars has to offer.

Day 10 Slieve League, Glencolmcille, Ardara, Assaranca Waterfall

For a spot of lunch your driver will take you to Glen Head Tavern, a hearty pub serving up traditional Irish pub grub to keep your belly full for the second half of the day.

Your driver will take you north-east until you reach **Ardara**. You will weave through Glengesh Pass enjoying tremendous views. If time permits, your driver can take you

to **Assaranca Waterfall** and **Maghera Beach**. Make sure you have your camera at the ready, both are flawless natural beauty spots.

Day 1 Arrive in Dublin

Accommodation – The Westbury Hotel, Dublin (2 Nights)

And if it's some retail therapy you're after, Henry Street is the place to go.

Up first today is a **private walking tour of Dublin**, a city which is absolutely bursting at the seams with enchanting stories.

You will meet your expert tour guide in Dublin city centre and the tour kicks off with a visit to **Dublin Castle** which dates back to 1230 after King John of England decided that a castle should be built to defend Dublin. Its location is no accident as it was strategically placed such that the River Poddle would provide a natural barrier against any invading armies.

Serving many purposes over the years – defensive fortress, parliament, court, military base – Dublin Castle has played an instrumental role throughout Ireland's history, and your guide will go into all the (sometimes grizzly) details.

From there you will wind your way past City Hall and on to **Trinity College Library**. Here you will get a chance to view some of the treasured artefacts they have on display, such as the Proclamation of the Irish Republic (1916), "Brian Boru's" harp, which was crafted in the 14th century, and the Book of Kells, which was written in the 9th century. **The Book of Kells** is written in Latin and is considered one of the most important manuscripts in Christian literature. It was written by Columban monks and depicts the four Gospels.



After that you will head to **Temple Bar**, arguably the most famous spot in Dublin and certainly the nerve centre of the city's social scene. Winding cobbled streets are packed with busy bars and cosy pubs where you will find talented musicians drumming up a lively atmosphere.

Next up is the **Guinness Storehouse** experience. Spread over 7 floors, you will learn how Guinness is made and what the key ingredients are. Interactive displays are on hand to tell you the history of this iconic Irish institution. You will then reach the gravity bar, which boasts unrivalled view across the Dublin skyline, and enjoy a crisp, cold pint of Guinness.

For dinner this evening you will be heading to **The Winding Stair**, a restaurant which also doubles, rather unusually, as a bookshop. With perfect views over the Liffey River and Ha'penny Bridge, it's hard to find a better spot to enjoy dinner. The menu emphasises traditional Irish home cooking with dishes such as smoked ox tongue and Black Angus Irish striploin on offer.

Day 3 Rock of Cashel, Blarney Castle and Stone, Cork

Your first stop today is a visit to **The Rock of Cashel**, which certainly looks like it could have inspired one or two Game of Thrones settings. The Rock of Cashel is a collection of medieval buildings which are perched atop a small rocky ridge in "The Golden Vale". As you stroll around these ancient buildings, you will wonder what it must have been like living here all the way back in the 12th and 13th centuries. The entire area is a wonderful sight to behold, but highlights include the round tower, gothic cathedral, and castle.

For your next stop your chauffeur will take you to **Blarney Castle and Stone**, a site steeped in myth and legend. The area around the castle is gorgeous, and the castle itself was built in the 12th century, so it's seen plenty of sights over the years. The Blarney Stone, so the folklore tells, will bless anyone who kisses it with the "gift of the gab" or the ability to speak fluently and persuasively. Here you will find the famous lakes of Killarney, as well as the McGillycuddy's Reeks, the highest mountain range in Ireland. The park is home to the last native herd of red deer in Ireland, so hopefully you will be lucky enough to spot them.

Having soaked up the sights Mother Nature has to offer; your chauffeur will take you to **Muckross House** to enjoy the splendour of Tudor architecture, as well as the pristine gardens which surround the house. Muckross House was given to the Irish Free State by William Bourn and Arthur Vincent, and the house and surrounding estate formed the original national park, which has now expanded significantly.



In the afternoon you will be treated to a falconry experience at **Killarney Falconry**. Falconry is an ancient craft, with humans learning to work in tandem with these incredible creatures thousands of years ago. You will get to watch on in delight as the birds perform incredible feats of aerial acrobatics before getting up close and personal with them as they swoop and land on your gloved hand.

Tonight, you will be staying in **The Europe Hotel** which is nestled on the shores of Lough Léin and enjoys magnificent views across the lough and over to the McGillycuddy's Reeks beyond.

Your journey begins by heading over the **Gap of Dunloe**, a slender mountain pass separating the McGillycuddy's Reeks and Purple Mountain ranges. Your chauffeur will then make a stop off at **Rossbeigh Beach**, the perfect opportunity to snap some photos of the incredible views across the Atlantic Ocean.

You will then snake your way to **Cahersiveen**, a small, traditional Irish town and the ideal place to grab some lunch from a local café. Here you will get a chance to visit the famous **Pat Cohan Bar** which shot to fame when the 1952 John Wayne movie "The Quiet Man" was filmed there. To this day there are still little reminders of the pub's, and the village's, claim to fame dotted around the place.

Dog lovers will be excited by the next stop at **Caherconnell** where you will be treated to a **private sheepdog demonstration**. It's a marvellous sight to behold as humans and dogs work as one to manoeuvre the sheep slowly but accurately around the field and into the pen. The ruins of **Caherconnell Fort** are also on the site and well worth exploring.

Malta - Rabat and M'dina private guided tour

Today you will enjoy a full day tour in Rabat and Mdina, situated just outside Valletta.

Rabat is located south on the island of Malta and borders the ancient village of M'dina. It is a jewel of history and archeology and above all an important religious center. In fact, Rabat has for centuries hosted the convents of Dominican, Augustinian and Franciscan friars who still live here today. A day in Rabat will allow you to savor the glorious evidence of the Maltese archipelago and to visit Roman artifacts such as the Roman Villa and the catacombs of San Paolo. At this point, according to legend, St. Paul took refuge after a shipwreck in 60 AD. A curiosity: most of the scenes of Steven Spielberg's film Munich were shot right here in Malta, and many exteriors were shot in Rabat.

M'dina, the ancient capital of Malta, is worth a visit because it is a real treasure trove of history. The silent city, as they call it, and it is easy to imagine the reason: a 4,000-year-old center, surrounded by narrow streets and ancient noble palaces, at 190 meters above sea level, in an atmosphere perfectly halfway between Baroque and the Middle Ages, bordered by palm trees, olive trees, prickly pears.

M'dina was the residence of the Maltese noble families, and even today the charm remains unchanged: there are about 400 residents and life goes on quietly, a day in Medina will allow you to discover its beauties, such as the Cathedral of San Paolo, erected in 1600, and Palazzo Falson, the oldest Norman residence in M'dina, which houses a museum with treasures such as silver, tapestries and works by Van Dyck. And if you find yourself in these parts in the spring, let yourself be carried away by history with the Medieval Festival: the city comes to life with historical re-enactments and costume parades.

Day 8 Malta



Malta - The 3 Cities

Visit the 3 cities of Malta, an appellation that brings together the 3 fortified cities of Cospicua, Vittoriosa and Sengles.

The three cities of Malta" are located a short distance from Valletta, the capital of the island, in a historical site known as La Cottonera. The name derives from their particular arrangement: very close to each other, they create a unique urban formation in the bay of Valletta. This place, due to its geographical characteristics, constituted a strategic enclave to defend the island, protected by imposing stone fortifications.

Senglea

The heavy bombings suffered during the Second World War failed to erase its historical and cultural beauties. A walk along Calle Settembru, the main city artery, is enough to appreciate the great treasures that this small 16th century city can still boast. Senglea, the invicta city (the invincible city), is a charming town that looks towards the Grand Harbor with a vigilant attitude, as evidenced by the tower of the Fortress of San Michele, whose surface reveals eyes and ears carved in stone. A magical place from which to admire magnificent views of the port.

Vittoriosa

After the Great Siege of Malta, which took place in 1565, important monuments of Vittoriosa survived, such as the Church of San Lorenzo, the ancient palace of the Governor of the Galleons and that of the Order of the Treasury of San Giovanni, the Palace of the Grand Inquisitor or the Fort Ricasoli. The latter was the scene of famous films such as Troy or Gladiator, making it a must for cinema lovers.

Vittoriosa, also known as Birgu, was at the time the residence of the nobles and knights of Castile: it is no coincidence that it is considered the most elegant and noble of the "three cities of Malta". Part of its prestige is due to the fact that it was the Maltese capital until 1565, when it was moved to Valletta.

Cospicua

In chronological order, Cospicua - Bormla in Maltese - is the most recent of the fortified cities overlooking the Bay of Valletta. Its historical identity is preserved intact in places such as the Church of the Immaculate Conception, the interior of which houses one of the most important art collections in the country, or in the Lines of Santa Margarita, the building that delimits one of the city's defensive lines.

The largest of the "Three Cities of Malta" was also one of the hardest hit by bombing in World War II and parts of its historical heritage was forced to reinvent itself after the conflict. Its labyrinth of steep streets, however, still retains a special charm that extends from the walls of the Grand Harbor to the upper part of the city.

Day 9 Malta



Malta - Popeye village

Popeye Village, the cartoonish village located in the bay of Anchor in Malta and which has become famous for being the set of the Popeye-Popeye film. Also known as **Sweethaven Village**, Popeye Village owes its fame to the 1980 Popeye film produced by **Paramount and Walt Disney**, and starring a very young Robin Williams. It is a group of picturesque and ramshackle wooden houses, in various pastel colors, which populate the northwest corner of the Mediterranean island of Malta, a few miles from the village of Mellieha.

This village began as a film set and is now open to the public as an open-air museum and family entertainment complex.

The construction of this entire seaside village perched on the cliff overlooking the sea began in 1979. A demanding job that led to the construction of 19 real wooden buildings in all respects. The following year, shooting began on the film, based on the comic by Elzie Segar, which narrates the heroic exploits of Popeye, or Popeye, the sailor with powerful forearms who becomes invincible thanks to spinach.

The village, once filming was over, was not torn down and now presents itself as a popular tourist destination offering attractions for the whole family.

It is one of the major tourist attractions on the Maltese Islands filled with a number of colorful fun activities for all young and young at heart.





Welcome to Portugal!

- **Distance:** 5.7 km point-to-point / 11.4 km out-and-back

From the Seven Hanging Valleys Trail, there are many gorgeous lookout points where you'll see limestone stacks and natural arches around Marinha Beach. As you progress, you'll encounter wooden barriers. Please respect these restricted zones, as they are in place to protect the cliffs and sinkholes from further erosion and for your safety.

From the start of the trail, it takes about an hour to reach Benagil Beach. Before you reach Benagil, you'll see the untouched **Praia da Corredoura** beach, which can only be reached from the sea.

Benagil Beach is beautiful in its own right, but it's popular because of its proximity to Benagil Cave (Algar de Benagil). Note: **Benagil cave** can only be accessed from the sea. On the trail, you can see the cave from above, but it's unremarkable. The barrier prevents you from getting too close, so there's nothing really to see from the trail vantage point.

If you want to visit the Algarve's most famous cave, you can either rent a standup paddleboard or hop on a boat tour from the beach. You can also swim. However, with the number of boats entering the cave, you'll want to take special care if you're swimming.

From Benagil Beach, the trail continues on the other side of the small parking lot. You'll have to walk across the outdoor terrace of Casa Lamy (café) to continue the hike.

Next, the Seven Hanging Valleys Trail continues to Carvalho Beach. This beautiful golden cove framed by limestone cliffs is accessible via a man-made tunnel.

The coastal trail rises above Carvalho Beach and continues to **Alfanzina Lighthouse**. The lighthouse is fenced off, so you'll have to walk around it. After the lighthouse, you're on the final stretch to Praia de Vale Centianes. You'll pass by white-washed residential homes and one massive apartment complex before descending a series of stairs to **Vale Centianes**.

Day 11

From the Algarve to your hotel in Lisbon, you will go along the southwest coast of Portugal, the last wild coast in Europe, protected along most of its length by strict environmental laws. The Costa Vicentina, as it is known, is rich in pristine beaches, and small fishing villages with the freshest fish and seafood.

You will start admiring the viewpoint of Ponta da Piedade and the beautiful beach of Meia Praia.

You will arrive in Lagos, a fishing small village with two thousand years of history, from where the explorers' routes departed.

You will continue with Sagres, a must-see destination for its beaches and the immensity of its landscapes. Its fortress, classified as a National monument was built in the 15th century.

You will put your feet in Cape St. Vincent, the most southwestern point of Europe and considered for many years "the end of the world", and you will see its lighthouse, one of the most powerful lighthouses in Europe which looks out one of the busiest trade routes in the world.

You will make a stop at the coastal village of Zambujeira do Mar, to stretch your legs, breathe the fresh air, and have lunch in a typical seafood restaurant by the beach.










Today morning, our driver and guide will pick you up for a private guided tour of the Alhambra Palace and Generalife Gardens.

Although the Paseo de los Tristes is officially called Andres Manjon, it is known by this name because funeral processions on the way to the cemetery once passed through it.



From the farm you will be driven to **Nairn**, a serene seaside town on Scotland's north-east coast. To learn more about the local history, head to Nairn Museum in Viewfield House which is full of displays detailing many aspects of Nairn's colourful past. After that, a stroll along the golden sands of Nairn Beach is a must.

Culloden Battlefield is next on the itinerary today. This site is of huge significance in Scottish history as it is here that the famous Jacobite Rising was ultimately defeated in 1746. However, the British Government forces led by Prince William Augustus crushed them once and for all in the last pitched battle on British soil. While you won't have time to climb it on this trip, simply witnessing the majesty of this imposing mountain is enough to put a smile on your face. Of course, there will be plenty opportunities to take pictures of this majestic mountain.

There are other ways to reach up into the mountains, however, such as the Nevis Range **Mountain Gondola**, your next stop. This impressive feat of engineering transports you 650 metres up the side of **Aonach Mòr**, the 8th highest mountain in the UK, all the while enjoying the unbeatable scenery of the Scottish Highlands. Once at the top, you can spend some time taking in the views and enjoying some of the scenic walks.

Next up is a visit to the **Glenfinnan Viaduct** and **Monument**. The viaduct is famous as the bridge the Hogwarts Express travels over in the Harry Potter movies, while the monument is dedicated to the Jacobite Uprising of the 18th century.

Afterwards you will travel to **Mallaig** and take the scenic ferry from Mallaig to Armadale on the beautiful **Isle of Skye**.

You will drive along the coastal Sleat peninsula, the most southerly point in Skye and on to **Kinloch Lodge Hotel**, your accommodation on the Isle of Skye for a relaxed evening of fine dining.

Waving goodbye to the fairies, it's off to Trotternish Ridge next, a rugged landscape of jutting rock formations, with the pinnacle being the **Old Man of Storr**.

Before you route back down to your hotel you will visit the main town on the Island, the beautiful **Portree**. Explore this bustling sea side town and its scenic harbor, complete with picturesque rainbow houses.

In the evening you will return to Kinloch Lodge for another evening of relaxation and fine dining.



Day 1





Welcome to Spain!

Upon arrival at Madrid Airport, our driver will be waiting for you at the arrivals hall to transfer you to your hotel.



In the afternoon, our guide will pick you up for a private guided tour of the Art Triangle and Prado Museum.

Madrid is one of the cities in Europe with the vastest collections of art and Prado is considered one of the greatest art museums in the world.

It was originally designed in 1785 to host a museum of natural science, but it was finally opened to the public for the first time in November 1819 to exhibit a Royal art collection. This very first Royal collection started to increase significantly in the 16th century and continued to thrive under the succeeding Monarchs.

Currently, the collection comprises around 8,200 drawings, 7,600 paintings, 4,800 prints and 1,000 sculptures, in addition to many other works of art and historic documents. It is the main Spanish national art museum and it is widely considered to have one of the world's finest art collections of European and Spanish art.

You will be able to admire the masterpieces of renowned artists such as Velázquez, El Greco, Goya, Bosch, Rubens, Titian and Raphael, among many others.

Apart from visiting the museum, you will also discover the architectural and historic landmarks in the surroundings, such as Paseo del Prado, Cibeles, Puerta de Alcala, etc.

Day 2



Today morning, our local guide will pick you up at the hotel for a private guided walking tour of the old part of the city: the Habsburgs' quarter, noteworthy places such as Puerta del Sol, Plaza Mayor, San Miguel Market...and the most emblematic buildings such as the Royal Palace.

End Time

Duration

In the 16th century, Felipe II established his court in Madrid. By then, the city was nothing but a myriad of small houses, churches and streets with a population of just 20,000 inhabitants. The kingdom of the Habsburgs, to show off their powerful empire and wealth, had to invest to develop and transform the city with a great variety of buildings and infrastructures, such as the iconic Plaza Mayor and the Puerta del Sol, which became the geographical center of Spain. The aristocracy also built their mansions in this area, which became really rich in terms of architecture, ranging from the late Renaissance through the early Baroque.

The works culminated in the 18th century with the construction of the Royal Palace, which is a magnificent architectural masterpiece with an impressive inside decoration full of frescos, tapestries, etc. So, today, along with this tour, you will be traveling back to the Golden Age of Madrid and its magnificent buildings.

In the afternoon, free time to keep exploring the city on your own.

Start Time





Upon arrival at Toledo railway station, our guide will be waiting for you to walk you around this beautiful UNESCO World Heritage City, a labyrinth of historical streets located on a hill and surrounded by the Tagus river.

It is known as the Imperial City because it was the main venue of the court of Charles V before he established it in Madrid. Due to its varied and vast monumental, historical and cultural heritage, it is also known as the city of the three cultures because Moors, Christians, and Jews managed to peacefully cohabit in the city for centuries and they all left their traces in the architecture which defines the town today and which makes it such a special and interesting place.

Along this tour, you will visit three sites in Toledo:

- the Primate Cathedral of Saint Mary of Toledo: this 13th-century temple is one of the jewels of Gothic architecture in Spain. It is brilliant, both outside and inside, where apart from many architectural and artistic gems, you will also discover amazing works of El Greco, Caravaggio, Tiziano, Goya, or Rubens.
- the Synagogue of El Transito or Samuel ha-Levi: it is the most important Hispanic-Jewish building in Spain and the most beautiful and best-preserved medieval synagogue in the world. It is also home to the Sefardi Museum, where you will be able to learn about the Jewish culture in Spain.
- the Church of Santo Tomé: this church, which was rebuilt at the beginning of the 14th century by the Lord of Orgaz, is famous because it hosts the painting "The Burial of the Count of Orgaz" by El Greco.

After the tour, free time for lunch. After lunch, you will go back to the railway station to take a high-speed train to Madrid.

Upon arrival, our driver will be waiting for you to transfer you to your hotel.



Today morning, our driver will pick you up to transfer you to the railway station, where you will take a high-speed train to Seville.

Upon arrival, our local driver will be waiting for you to transfer you to your hotel.



In the evening, you will enjoy a very special experience: a private passionate evening of tapas and flamenco in the magical Triana quarter of Seville.

Tonight, you will learn how flamenco emerged from SouthWest Spain as a result of a slow fusion of the ancient multicultural musical heritage of Southern Spain with the original gypsy rhythms and musical roots. This will set the context for (and enhance the appreciation of) the selected flamenco performance in a small and intimate venue that will follow, with 4 people onstage: a guitar player, a singer and two dancers.

After the performance, you will be taken on a tapas tour of Triana. You will visit two or three selected bars where the locals like to gather with friends and family and where you will taste a selection of 6 - 9 tapasdishes to share that you'll be able to pair with the corresponding wines. This will giveyou an understanding of what going for tapas means in Seville (or in Triana) and how it is enjoyed, shared and celebrated.





Today morning, our guide will pick you up for a private guided tour of the old part of the city, Santa Cruz quarter, and its most emblematic monuments.

Along this tour, you will enjoy a walk around the fascinating **Sta. Cruz quarter**, the former Jewish quarter of the Medieval city, where the Jews were confined when Ferdinand III took the city from the Moors in 1248. It is a labyrinth of winding narrow streets with quaint houses, patios and gardens in bloom all year round, lovely tiny squares...where the legends of its Sephardic past will be brought alive and can still be felt in the atmosphere.

You will also visit the Cathedral of Seville (UNESCO World Heritage Site), which is the third-largest church and the largest Gothic Cathedral in the world. It was built in the 15th century and its construction lasted over a century. It was planned under the statement "Let us build a church so beautiful and so magnificent that those who see it finished think that we are mad". It was built on the site of the great Aljama mosque and some remaining parts of the Mosque are still preserved: the Patio de Naranjas, the Puerta del perdón and the Giralda (former Minaret and now the belltower). It is also popular because Christopher Columbus is buried here.

Finally, you will also visit the Royal Alcazar, another UNESCO World Heritage Site, which became very popular a few years ago because it was one of the film settings of Game of Thrones. It is a place different from what you have seen so far. It is a colorful and charming site that will transport you to a different era, an experience you will never forget. Its handpainted tiles, its blooming and lush idyllic gardens, its fountains, its legends...make it a really special place and a must-see place when visiting Seville. One curiosity: it is the oldest active royal palace in Europe.

In the afternoon, free time to keep exploring the city and some other heritage sites such as Spain Square, Maria Luisa Park or Triana Quarter.

Day 6





In the morning, our driver will pick you up to transfer you to Cordoba.

Upon arrival, our local guide will be waiting for you for a private guided tour of two of its UNESCO World Heritage Sites: the Jewish quarter and the Mosque-Cathedral.

The Jewish quarter boasts a unique charm filled with winding narrow streets, whitewashed façades, flower pots, quaint squares...You will visit Flowers' Street, Pañuelo Street, the Maimonides Monument, Judios Street, the Zoco, the synagogue...

After strolling around the lovely streets, you will visit the Mosque-Cathedral. This spectacular building is one of the jewels of Muslim architecture in Spain and a stunning blend of the two religions and cultures which have shaped Andalucia: Islam and Christianity. A magnificent awe-inspiring architectural masterpiece that amazes all travelers. Its main hall with over 850 double-arched columns is one of the best and most impressive examples of this architectural gem.

(During the spring months, especially in the month of May when the flowers contest takes place, you will also visit some patios - courtyards- of the houses, which are decorated with lots of colorful flower pots.)

In the afternoon, our driver will transfer you back to Seville.

On the way, you will make a halt in Almodovar Castle, one of the best-preserved Medieval castles in Spain, from where you will enjoy stunning views of the Andalucian countryside.






The most famous image of Begur is undoubtedly the mediaeval castle that overlooks the town, although there are plenty of other places of interest to visit, such as the numerous "Indies" houses (built in the colonial style by townsfolk who emigrated to the Americas in the 19th century, fleeing the economic crisis of the era, and subsequently returned from the colonies with a considerable fortune), the 16th-century defensive towers (a legacy of the period when pirates sailed the Mediterranean, built by the people of Begur to protect themselves against attack), the church (built in the Gothic style and dedicated to St Peter), as well as such other historic buildings as the Cultural Centre and the Old School.

Day 3

You will first head to Mount Hernio to enjoy the mountain views and a short walk. Driving near to the summit of this rocky mountain, we will make a short walk out in the fields to admire both, the inland green valleys, and the Atlantic ocean.

Then, you will head to Loyola to discover the Basque history hints. An impressive religious monument, built between the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries around the Casa Torre is the birthplace of the founder of the Jesuites, St. Ignatius of Loyola.

It will be almost lunch time (lunch not included). So, you will head to Mount Izarraitz, where you will drive through narrow mountain roads, villages, sheep and cows … we will discover the essence of the Basque Country! Stop at the foothills of Mount Izarraitz to have beautiful views of the mountainous interior as well as the coastline.

After lunch, it is time for the coast...

You will head to Zumaia, where you will enjoy amazing coastal views and a short walk. Zumaia is The place where the green mountains, suddenly meet the Atlantic Ocean! Take a walk of 30 minutes for a nice spot to discover an amazing place! At this point of the coast, the mountains drop steeply to sea level, with wonderful views and let us look at the raw rock formations formed over millions of years.

Finally, you will end your tour in one of the best samples of a Basque fishing village: Getaria. The charming little fishing village of Getaria. Home of Juan Sebastian Elcano (Getaria 1487-1526) the man who was first to sail around the world. It is probably one of the most treasured medieval centers which best reflects the passing of time.

In the later afternoon, transfer back to your hotel in San Sebastian.

Day 4



Today morning, together with our guide/driver, you will make your way to a real sheep farm, located in the rolling Basque hills, to taste and learn about one of the culinary icons of the area, Idiazabal cheese.

The owner will lead you through the farm, giving you an intimate insight into the production starting with the milking process in the Milking Room

Using the fresh milk you just got, you will participate in the process of cheese-making to finally have a great tasting session of 4 different kinds of cheeses paired with wine or cider.

After the sheep farm, you will head to get immersed into another great local approach.

You will visit a Basque farmhouse run by the same family since the 16th Century. By the hand of a member of the family, devoted to recovering the indigenous Basque pig, you will learn how those pigs are reared and understand the traditional role of these self-sufficient traditional Basque farms.

These happy pigs are fed in green raingrass pasture, full of white and purple clover, hay and mountain herbs, nettle and Rumex roots, and the fruits of our centuries-old native hardwoods.

You will also enjoy a very special home-made meal at the family's dining room. The meal is prepared using only homemade products including their ham and charcuterie, beef meat, wild mushroom, etc. accompanied with plenty of Rioja wines or Cider.



Today, our driver/guide will pick you up and together, you will cross the French border and explore the southern coastal part of France.

You will first head to Biarritz, one of the most posh beach resorts of the Basque Coast. It is a luxurious seaside town and is popular with tourists and surfers. Biarritz also boasts some of the best beaches in Europe. Biarritz's became more renowned in 1854 when Empress Eugenie (the wife of Napoleon III) built a palace on the beach (now the Hôtel du Palais). The British royal family and European royalty regularly took vacations in Biarritz.

The workshop with Pilar will take place in her historical typical Masia, a lovely estate where after the cooking class, you will enjoy lunch together with her husband René, who offers a selection of excellent Spanish wines.

She can adapt her menus to any request. Pilar can even reproduce an authentic El Bulli menu as she is a personal friend of Ferran Adrià and took lessons at his kitchen.



Today morning, our driver and guide will pick you up to transfer you to Figueres, where Dali was born. Here, you will visit Dali's Museum and will learn a little bit more about this eccentric artist and his work.

After the Museum, you will head to Cadaqués, a lovely fishing village which served as inspiration to Dali and many other artists, who all placed their residence in this beautiful coastal town.

When the artist met the love of his life, Gala, he broke away from his parents and bought a fishermen's hut there.

It was here that Dalí lived from 1930 onwards, gradually altering and enlarging the original dwelling he bought there and which shared the same name as the bay.

The house of Port Lligat must be considered Dalí's only true home. It was in this studio that he painted the majority of his great works. Every detail of the house bears his imprint, and the house still contains his original furniture and decoration.

Casa Amatller is another must-see house and having a coffee in the coffee shop inside is a pleasure.

Some not so well-known art-nouveau buildings which are worth a visit are:

- Hospital de Sant Pau
- · Casa Vicens: the first architectural work by Gaudi, which was recently opened to the public about one year ago
- Music Palace: Located in the Born quarter, in the old part of the city, it is a masterpiece of Art Nouveau architecture, and well worth a visit. Its interior is gorgeous...and if you can enjoy a corcert in it, it is even better.

Ciutadella Park: The Parc de la Ciutadella is very idyllic and probably the greenest oasis in the megacity of Barcelona. It invites you to relax, to rebound and to go for long walks, as well as for a picnic. You can also use a rowing boat on the lake. The Catalan Parliament and the Modern Art Museum are lcoated in there.


